Important Notes and Points

♣ Half life for an nth order reaction involving reactant A and $n \neq 1$

$$t_{1/2} = \frac{2^{n-1} - 1}{(n-1)k[A_0]^{n-1}}$$

- Chemical kinetics has many applications in the field of pharmaceuticals. It is used to study the lifetimes and bioavailability of drugs within the body and this branch of study is called **pharmacokinetics** Doctors usually prescribe drugs to be taken at different times of the day. i.e.some drugs are to be taken twice a day, while others are taken three times a day, or just once a day.
- Pharmacokinetic studies is used to determine the prescription (dosage and frequency). For example, Paracetamol is a well known anti-pyretic and analgesic that is prescribed in cases of fever and body pain. Pharmacokinetic studies showed that Paracetamol has a half-life of 2.5 hours within the body i.e.the plasma concentration of a drug is halved after 2.5 hrs. After 10 hours (4 half-lives)only 6.25 % of drug remains. Based on such studies the dosage and frequency will be decided. In case of paracetamol, it is usually prescribed to take once in 6 hours depending upon the conditions.
